Fun Facts about IU

- The Little 500 started in 1951 and is the country's largest college bike race. The Academy Award winning 1979 movie, *Breaking Away*, was filmed in Bloomington and based on the Little 500.
- I.M. Pei, the architect of the Louvre Pyramid, also designed IU's Eskenazi Museum of Arts.
- It's a tradition for first-year students to shake the hand of the statue of Herman B. Wells (pictured right) for good luck.
- The Lilly Library holds a New Testament of the Gutenberg Bible, the First Folio of Shakespeare's works, and the first printed edition of The Canterbury Tales.
- Four red clocks around campus play the IU fight song at the top of every hour.
- The Showalter Fountain in the center of campus depicts the birth of Venus. One of the fish disappeared following the IU men's basketball victory march through campus during the 1987 NCAA Championship. A reproduction of the fish was restored to the fountain in 2009.

- The first color television was manufactured in Bloomington. Sarkes Tarzian and RCA produced the RCA CT-100 on March 25, 1954 at the plant on South Rogers Street.
- Fluoride toothpaste (Crest) was invented in Bloomington.
- Founded in 1818 by a group of settlers who were impressed with "a haven of blooms" that they called it Bloomington.
- Bloomington is known as the "Gateway to the Scenic Southern Indiana."
- According to Lumosity, Bloomington is ranked as the 7th smartest city in America!
- Indiana is called the Hoosier state. One theory: a man named Hoosier preferred to employ men from Indiana. He called his employees Hoosiers.
